[Authorization for the Office of the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors to provide clerical, administrative, and logistical assistance to the San Francisco Local Agency Formation Commission.]

Resolution authorizing the Office of the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors consistent with past practice to provide clerical, administrative, and logistical assistance to the San Francisco Local Agency Formation Commission for the purpose of instituting its Advice and Monitoring Project with respect to CCA Program Implementation as requested by the San Francisco Board of Supervisors and for the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors to seek reimbursement from San Francisco Local Agency Formation Commission.

WHEREAS, Local Agency Formation Commissions ("LAFCOs") were created in every county by the California Legislature in 1963 to encourage the orderly formation and expansion of local governmental agencies; and,

WHEREAS, San Francisco LAFCO's ("SF LAFCO") activities have previously been limited due to the nature of the organization of San Francisco as a consolidated city and county, and fulfilling the duties and responsibilities set forth in the Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Local Government Reorganization Act of 2000 (the "Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Act"), Government Codes §§ 56000 et seq. has not required the full time and attention of the Executive Officer, and no other staff has been required; and,

WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors has charged SF LAFCO, by Ordinance 0146-07, file #070777, with providing an advisory role for the implementation of its Community Choice Aggregation ("CCA") Program, to assist with the startup of the CCA Program and advise the Board of Supervisors, San Francisco Public Utilities Commission ("SFPUC") and

other agencies regarding all aspects of development, implementation, operation, and management of the CCA Program; and,

WHEREAS, SF LAFCo agreed in its resolution number 2007-01, to monitor the SFPUC's implementation of the CCA Program and provide advice to the Board of Supervisors as to CCA Program implementation; and,

WHEREAS, In 2000, the Board of Supervisors authorized the Clerk of the Board of the Board of Supervisors to serve as the part-time Executive Officer of SF LAFCO, to perform such duties and fulfill such responsibilities as are prescribed in the Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Act; and,

WHEREAS, SF LAFCO will need additional clerical, administrative, and logistic support to monitor the SFPUC's implementation of the CCA Program and provide advice to the Board of Supervisors as to CCA Program implementation; and

WHEREAS, The Office of the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors has the requisite skills, expertise in, and access to, relevant City policies and procedures to provide such clerical, administrative, and logistic support; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby authorizes the Office of the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors to provide staff and support to SF LAFCO to perform such duties and fulfill such responsibilities as assigned by SF LAFCo consistent with Ordinance 0146-07, file #070777, and additional duties and responsibilities associated with monitoring the SFPUC's implementation of the CCA Program and providing advice to the Board of Supervisors as to CCA Program implementation; and, be it

FURTHER MOVED, That the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors is authorized to seek reimbursement from SF LAFCO for any and all actual expenses incurred and/or for additional staff time such assistance may require, via work order, invoice, or other such device.
