



The Department on the Status of Women and the Department of the Environment have teamed up to launch the 2nd Annual Cell Phone Drive for City Employees to highlight the month of October as *Domestic Violence Awareness Month*.

The Department on the Status of Women has partnered with Verizon Wireless' *HopeLine Project* which refurbishes used cell phones and provides survivors of domestic violence with 3,000 pre-paid minutes. As the distribution and collection center, the Department processes cell phones to be sent to a recycling facility where reusable materials are reclaimed and cell phones in good working order are refurbished and redistributed to community-based service providers in the City.

Together with the leadership of Mayor Gavin Newsom, the Department on the Status of Women has made violence against women a priority. About 75% of the Department's annual budget goes towards funding community-based organizations aimed at preventing or intervening in cases of violence against women.
