# Resolution to Transfer the Museums' 20% Partial Interest in Mark Adams tapestry, *Great Wing*, 1961, (2000.165), a gift from Mr. and Ms. Walter S. Newman, to the Oakland Museum of California

WHEREAS, On December 14, 2000 the Fine Arts Museums of San Francisco accepted a gift from Mr. and Mrs. Walter S. Newman of a 10% partial interest in *Great Wing*, 1961, a tapestry by Mark Adams, to the Textiles Collection of the Fine Arts Museums. On October 18, 2001, the Museums accepted an additional 10% partial interest in the tapestry from Mr. and Mrs. Newman. The work was assigned the accession number 2000.165.

WHEREAS, The tapestry was determined to be no longer essential to the permanent collection and Mrs. Newman has determined that she would like to transfer the interest she and her late husband had given the Museums to the Oakland Museum of California; and

WHEREAS, The tapestry has remained at the donors' home and has not been displayed at the Museums since the first partial interest was accessioned in 2000; and

WHEREAS, The tapestry will be available for viewing by the public at the Oakland Museum of California and transferring the interest in this work will benefit a sister arts organization in the Bay Area; and

WHEREAS, The transfer of the Museums' 20% interest in *Great Wing* to The Oakland Museum of California would be accomplished in furtherance of the public interest and in accordance with Section 2A.155.10 of the San Francisco Administrative Code, pertaining to the Transfer of Works of Art; and

WHEREAS, The Director of Museums recommends to the Acquisitions Committee that *Great Wing* be approved for transfer to the Oakland Museum of California for cultural reasons; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Acquisitions Committee does hereby accept the recommendation of the Director of Museums, and in accordance with Section 2A.155.10 of the San Francisco Administrative Code, pertaining to the Sale, Exchange or Transfer of Works of Art, recommends to the Boards of Trustees the approval of the transfer of the tapestry listed below to the Oakland Museum of California:
