Trustee Zanze proposed the following resolution setting the number of Executive Committee positions:

WHEREAS, On January 30, 2013, the Fine Arts Museums of San Francisco Bylaws were amended to provide for a variable number of Executive Committee members; and WHEREAS, The amendment stated that the authorized number of Executive Committee Members shall be at least thirteen, the exact number to be set by the Board of Trustees from time to time; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Trustees of the Fine Arts Museums of San Francisco does hereby set the number of Executive Committee members at seventeen (17) until such number is changed by this Board.

Upon motion, duly seconded, there was no discussion among Trustees. There was no public testimony. Trustees voted unanimously to adopt the above resolution setting the number of Executive Committee position as **Board Resolution 1811.**

IV. Report of the President

Approval of the Minutes of the June 4, 2015 Meeting of the Board of Trustees

There being no discussion among Trustees or comments from the public, the minutes of the June 4, 2015 meeting of the Board of Trustees, having been delivered in advance to all Trustees, were unanimously approved.

Approval of the Report of the September 15, 2015 Acquisitions Committee Meeting

President Wilsey called on George Hecksher, Vice President of Collections and Chair of the Acquisitions Committee. Mr. Hecksher reviewed the activity of the September 15, 2015 Acquisitions Committee. Mr. Hecksher called on a series of curators to review some of the major acquisitions. Timothy Anglin Burgard, Curator in Charge of the American Art Department reviewed the purchase of an Orozco painting. Karin Breuer, Curator in Charge of the Achenbach Foundation for Graphic Arts reviewed a major purchase/gift combination from the Paulson-Bott Archives. Jill D'Alessandro, Curator of the Textile Arts Department, reviewed several gifts of Oscar de la Renta costumes that will be included in the upcoming exhibition.

Mr. Hecksher proposed the following resolution to approve the Acquisition Committee report:

RESOLVED, That the Board of Trustees of the Fine Arts Museums of San Francisco does hereby approve the appended September 15, 2015 report of the Acquisitions Committee of the Fine Arts Museums Foundation, including approving the works of art acquired through purchase and donation as gifts to the Fine Arts Museums of San Francisco from the Fine Arts Museums Foundation, and approving first step deaccessioning, second step deaccessioning and the sale of non-accessioned art.

V. Committee Reports

Education Committee

Carol Bonnie, Chair of the Education Committee reported that a new Family Art Table will be set up every Saturday in Wilsey Court, and that the October 17 Community Day will celebrate the 10th Anniversary of the new de Young. Sheila Pressley, Director of Education reviewed the Annual Report for Education, highlighting the breadth, depth and diversity of the Museums' education programs that include school, family, public, docent, college, and access programs, with over 270,000 participants in last year's education programs. The full report is attaché to these minutes as Appendix II.

de Youngsters

Trustee Holland Lynch, Chair of de Youngsters reported that a Family Welcome Station sponsored by the de Youngters will adjoin the Family Art Table in Wilsey Court on Saturdays. The second family access day was held on September 12, when children with special needs explored the museum in a less-crowded and more meaningful environment. Other events are being developed to educate parents on how to visit the museums with their families including a parent training, in collaboration with the Education Department. There is also an international visual literacy conference being hosted at the de Young on November 2-3. This is being spearheaded by Strategic Projects in collaboration with Education. The Annual Art Party fundraising event is scheduled for January 8. Ticket sales and pledges are already robust.

Special Events and Strategic Projects

Trustee Holland Lynch continued with a report on Special Events, highlighting the Annual Donor Lunch. This year, the luncheon showcased the upcoming Oscar de la Renta retrospective, with guest speaker Boaz Mazor in conversation with Acting Director Richard Benefield. This resulted in significant support for the exhibition. She also reported that ArtPoint has seen significant increase in attendance at events. This group is critical to the future sustainability of the Museum.

<u>Marketing</u>

Trustee Jack Calhoun, Chair of the Marketing Committee, introduced the new head of Marketing, Susan Klein. The committee met yesterday and Trustee Calhoun reviewed their activities and discussions, plans for the next fiscal year, and noted that the Marketing team is analyzing all aspects of marketing, looking at content being developed, reviewing ticket pricing, management of images and emails to members and donors.
