Mr. Prohaska reviewed the primary components of the FAM department budget proposal to the City, which includes new proposed funding for the following:

- Staffing to be Open All Holidays Except Thanksgiving and Christmas
- Staffing for Friday Nights
- 5 Positions: Librarian, 2 Engineers, Security Supervisor and Collections Manager Tech
- Property Insurance for Both Museums
- New Security Cameras and Systems

Mr. Prohaska also reviewed the City budget timeline.

Acknowledging Funding Expended by the Corporation of the Fine Arts Museums

WHEREAS, The Corporation of the Fine Arts Museums is a 501(c)(3) not-for-profit corporation that exists to support the activities of the Fine Arts Museums of San Francisco; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Trustees of the Fine Arts Museums of San Francisco does hereby acknowledge with gratitude funding in the amount of \$12,481,281 expended by the Corporation of the Fine Arts Museums for operations during the period October 1, 2017 through December 31, 2017.

Public Comment

The following is a summary of the public comment from Dr. Elaine Tennant:

We have concerns, (reflected in conversations with other Deyoung Family Members, and museum staff), that the de Young's youth services have been modified, and in our opinion diminished. Our concerns include:

- Elimination of the free Saturday Doing & Viewing Art Program
- Elimination of the Visiting Artist Studio youth program
- Rewording of family membership privileges with respect to youth access
- The lack of programs permitting 3 6 year old children
- An apparent lack of transparency or input regarding these changes

Replacement programs lack the social interactions, personal expertise, and exposure to the arts inherent in the original programs. The family art table substitutes a crafts project for exposure to knowledgeable docents discussing works of art related to studio projects led by artists. Interactive computer activities substitute for visiting and working with practicing artists in the Visiting Artist Studio. We hope the programs as they existed before these changes can be restored.

There were no other public comments during the course of this meeting.
