MEMORANDUM

October 27, 2009:

LOUIS DILLON v. RECREATION & PARK COMMISSION (09053)

COMPLAINT

THE COMPLAINANT ALLEGES THE FOLLOWING:

Complainant Louis Dillon alleges that, on September 3, 2009, the Recreation and Parks Commission (the "Commission") improperly changed the time for its Special meeting from that previously noticed to the public.

COMPLAINANT FILES COMPLAINT:

On 9/3/2009, Louis Dillon filed a Public Meeting Complaint against the Commission for its alleged violations, without specifying the sections of law that had been violated.

JURISDICTION

The Commission is a policy body created under the San Francisco City Charter. Section 67.3(d) of the Sunshine Ordinance defines "policy body" to include: "2) Any other board or commission enumerated in the charter."

APPLICABLE STATUTORY SECTION(S):

Section 67 of the San Francisco Administrative Code:

Section 67.3 deals with Policy Bodies.

Section 67.6 deals with notice of Special Meetings of Policy Bodies.

Section 54950 et seq. of Cal. Gov't Code

Section 54956 deals with notice of Special Meetings of legislative bodies.

APPLICABLE CASE LAW:

none

ISSUES TO BE DETERMINED

1. FACTUAL ISSUES

A. Uncontested Facts: On September 3, 2009, the Commission held a public meeting that was described in its agenda as a Special Meeting of the Commission. The Commission agenda stated that the meeting would take place at 4:00 p.m. The City Hall Building Calendar for September 3, 2009, stated that the Commission meeting would take place at 1:30 p.m.

B. Contested facts/ Facts in dispute:

The Commission contends that it posted the meeting time and place of the Special Meeting on September 3, 2009 in compliance with local and state legal requirements. The Commission has provided actual agendas that describe the meeting as taking place at 4:00 p.m., as well as proof that these accurate agendas were mailed and emailed to the complainant, posted on the Commission's website, and provided to the library for posting there.

QUESTIONS THAT MIGHT ASSIST IN DETERMINING FACTS:

- What did the Commission's original meeting agenda for September 3, 2009 announce as the time of the meeting?
- Did the Commission subsequently change this time?
- Was any such change announced in a subsequent public notice?

LEGAL ISSUES/LEGAL DETERMINATIONS:

 Were sections of the Sunshine Ordinance, Brown Act, and/or California Constitution Article I, Section three violated?

SUGGESTED ANALYSIS

Under Section 67.3 of the Ordinance:

Determine whether the Commission is a "policy body."

Under Section 67.4 of the Ordinance:

• Determine whether the Commission complied with the meeting notification requirements.

ATTACHED STATUTORY SECTION FROM CHAPTER 67 OF THE SAN FRANCISCO ADMINISTRATIVE CODE UNLESS OTHERWISE SPECIFIED

Section 8 of the Administrative Code:

SEC. 8.16. FILING OF ANNUAL REPORTS AND OFFICIAL DOCUMENTS WITH SAN FRANCISCO PUBLIC LIBRARY.

Further, it shall be the duty of the secretary or other executive officer of each board, commission or committee thereof, to file with the Documents Department two copies of the agenda of each regularly scheduled meeting of such board, commission or committee thereof, at least 72 hours prior to the time of such meeting. For special meetings of boards, commissions or committees, the agenda shall be filed with the Documents Department not less than 24 hours prior to the meeting.

Section 67.3 of the Administrative Code (Sunshine Ordinance) defines policy bodies as follows:

- (d) policy bodies:
- (2) Any other board or commission enumerated in the charter.

Section 67.6 of the Administrative Code (Sunshine Ordinance) deals with special meetings of policy bodies as follows:

(e) Meetings of passive meeting bodies as specified in Section 67.6(d)(4) of this article shall be preceded by notice delivered personally or by mail, e-mail, or facsimile as reasonably requested at least 72 hours before the time of such meeting to each person who has requested, in writing, notice of such meeting. If the advisory body elects to hold regular meetings, it shall provide by bylaws, or whatever other rule is utilized by that advisory body for the conduct of its business, for the time and place for holding

such regular meetings. In such case, no notice of regular meetings, other than the posting of an agenda pursuant to Section 67.7 of this article in the place used by the policy body which it advises, is required.

- (f) Special meetings of any policy body, including advisory bodies that choose to establish regular meeting times, may be called at any time by the presiding officer thereof or by a majority of the members thereof, by delivering personally or by mail written notice to each member of such policy body and the local media who have requested written notice of special meetings in writing. Such notice of a special meeting shall be delivered as described in (e) at least 72 hours before the time of such meeting as specified in the notice. The notice shall specify the time and place of the special meeting and the business to be transacted. No other business shall be considered at such meetings. Such written notice may be dispensed with as to any member who at or prior to the time the meeting convenes files with the presiding officer or secretary of the body or commission a written waiver of notice. Such waiver may be given by telegram. Such written notice may also be dispensed with as to any member who is actually present at the meeting at the time it convenes. Each special meeting shall be held at the regular meeting place of the policy body except that the policy body may designate an alternate meeting place provided that such alternate location is specified in the notice of the special meeting; further provided that the notice of the special meeting shall be given at least 15 days prior to said special meeting being held at an alternate location. This provision shall not apply where the alternative meeting location is located within the same building as the regular meeting place.
- (g) If a meeting must be canceled, continued or rescheduled for any reason, notice of such change shall be provided to the public as soon as is reasonably possible, including posting of a cancellation notice in the same manner as described in section 67.7(c), and mailed notice if sufficient time permits.

SECTION 54950 ET SEQ. OF THE CAL. GOV'T CODE (BROWN ACT):

§ 54951. LOCAL AGENCY

As used in this chapter, "local agency" means a county, city, whether general law or chartered, city and county, town, school district, municipal corporation, district, political subdivision, or any board, commission or agency thereof, or other local public agency.

D. § 54952. LEGISLATIVE BODY, DEFINITION

As used in this chapter, "legislative body" means:

(a) The governing body of a local agency or any other local body created by state or federal statute.

§ 54956. SPECIAL MEETINGS; CALL; NOTICE

A special meeting may be called at any time by the presiding officer of the legislative body of a local agency, or by a majority of the members of the legislative body, by

delivering written notice to each member of the legislative body and to each local newspaper of general circulation and radio or television station requesting notice in writing. The notice shall be delivered personally or by any other means and shall be received at least 24 hours before the time of the meeting as specified in the notice. The call and notice shall specify the time and place of the special meeting and the business to be transacted or discussed. No other business shall be considered at these meetings by the legislative body. The written notice may be dispensed with as to any member who at or prior to the time the meeting convenes files with the clerk or secretary of the legislative body a written waiver of notice. The waiver may be given by telegram. The written notice may also be dispensed with as to any member who is actually present at the meeting at the time it convenes. The call and notice shall be posted at least 24 hours prior to the special meeting in a location that is freely accessible to members of the public.

THE CALIFORNIA CONSTITUTION AS AMENDED BY PROPOSITION 59 IN 2004 PROVIDES FOR OPENNESS IN GOVERNMENT.

Article I Section 3 provides:

- a) The people have the right to instruct their representative, petition government for redress of grievances, and assemble freely to consult for the common good.
- b)(1) The people have the right of access to information concerning the conduct of the people's business, and therefore, the meetings of public bodies and the writings of public officials and agencies shall be open to public scrutiny.
- 2) A statute, court rule, or other authority, including those in effect on the effective date of this subdivision that limits the right of access shall be adopted with findings demonstrating the interest protect by the limitation and the need for protecting that interest.
- 3) Nothing in this subdivision supersedes or modifies the right of privacy guaranteed by Section 1 or affects the construction of any statute, court rule, or other authority to the extent that it protects that right to privacy, including any statutory procedures governing discovery or disclosure of information concerning the official performance or professional qualifications of a peace officer.
- 4) Nothing in this subdivision supersedes or modifies any provision of this Constitution, including the guarantees that person may not be deprived of life, liberty, or property without due process of law, or denied equal protection of the laws, as provided by Section 7.
- 5) This subdivision does not repeal or nullify, expressly or by implication, any constitutional or statutory exception to the right of access to public records or meetings or public bodies that is in effect on the effective date of this subdivision, including, but

not limited to, any statute protecting the confidentiality of law enforcement and prosecution records.

6) Nothing in this subdivision repeals, nullifies, supersedes, or modifies protections for the confidentiality of proceedings and records of the Legislature, the Members of the Legislature, and its employees, committee, and caucuses provided by Section 7 of Article IV, state law, or legislative rules adopted in furtherance of those provisions: nor does it affect the scope of permitted discovery in judicial or administrative proceedings regarding deliberations of the Legislature, the Members of the Legislature, and its employees, committees, and caucuses.





DISABILITY ACCESS

Room 400 is wheelchair accessible. The closest accessible BART Station is the Civic Center station located at the intersection of Market, Hyde and Grove Streets, three blocks from City Hall.
