Remote Access to Information and Participation

In accordance with Governor Newsom's Executive Order No. N-33-20 declaring a State of Emergency regarding the COVID-19 outbreak and Mayor London N. Breed's Proclamation declaring a Local Emergency issued on February 25, 2020, including the guidance for gatherings issued by the San Francisco Department of Public Health Officer, aggressive directives were issued to reduce the spread of COVID-19. On March 17, 2020, the Board of Supervisors authorized their Board and Committee meetings to convene remotely (via Microsoft Teams) and will allow remote public comment via videoconference.

(On June 1, 2022, the Sunshine Ordinance Task Force moved to find that under the California Public Records Act 6254(b)(1) that personal emails used to conduct the public business are disclosable and orders the San Francisco City Librarian Michael Lambert and the San Francisco Public Library to disclose the email addresses to the petitioner and that this will be monitored by the Compliance and Amendments Committee and to find a violation 67.26 by failing to provide a key by foot note or other clear reference for the justification for the redactions and orders that the Public Librarian comply with this order within five business days.)

(On June 1, 2022, the Sunshine Ordinance Task Force moved by Member Schmidt, seconded by Member Neighbors to find a violation Administrative Code, Sunshine Ordinance, Section(s) 67.21(e) by failing to respond to the complaint in a complete and timely manner; 67.26 by failing to identify the actual redactions and justifications for redactions; 67.27(d) by failing to inform the requestor of the nature and extent of the nonexempt information; California Public Records Act Sections 6253(b) and (c) by failing to respond to the complaint in a complete and/or timely manner and orders the Police Department to go back and give a proper response to each item of the request including information about the relationship with other outside agencies and orders the Police Department to provide those records within five business days.

Meeting Procedures

Public Comment will be taken before or during the Committee's consideration of each agenda item. Speakers may address the Task Force for up to three minutes on that item. During General Public Comment, members of the public may address the Task Force on matters that are within the Task Force's jurisdiction and are not on the agenda. Any person speaking during a public comment period may supply a brief written summary of their comments, which shall, if no more than 150 words, be included in the official file.

Each member of the public will be allotted the same maximum number of minutes to speak as set by the Chair at the beginning of each item, excluding persons requested by the Task Force to make presentations, except that public speakers using interpretation assistance will be allowed to testify for twice the amount of the public testimony time limit. If simultaneous interpretation services are used, speakers will be governed by the public testimony time limit applied to speakers not requesting interpretation assistance.

Each member of the public who is unable to attend the public meeting or hearing may submit to the City, by the time the hearing begins, written comments regarding the agenda items. Disability Access

Please be advised that the Chair may order the removal from the meeting room of any person(s) responsible for the ringing or use of a cell phone, pager, or other similar sound-producing electronic devices (Chapter 67A of the San Francisco Administrative Code).

Individuals and entities that influence or attempt to influence local legislative or administrative action may be required by the San Francisco Lobbyist Ordinance [SF Campaign & Governmental Conduct Code, Section 2.100] to register and report lobbying activity. Under Campaign and Governmental Conduct Code, Section 1.127, no person or entity with a financial interest in a land use matter pending before the Board of Appeals, Board of Supervisors, Building Inspection Commission, Commission on Community Investment and Infrastructure, Historic Preservation Commission, Planning Commission, Port Commission, or the Treasure Island Development Authority Board of Directors, may make a campaign contribution to a member of the Board of Supervisors, the Mayor, the City Attorney, or a candidate for any of those offices, from the date the land use matter commenced until 12 months after the board or commission has made a final decision, or any appeal to another City agency from that decision has been resolved.
