5. General Public Comment

No public comment.

6. Presentation

a. Department of Public Health Budget Presentation

i. Presenter: Emily Gibbs, Budget Director

Director Gibbs gave a presentation on the budget proposal for the Department of Public Health.

Commissioner Marlow asked to clarify what their focus is when it comes to spending towards mental health, to which Gibbs said they focus a great deal of their budget to address mental health, especially when it comes to MediCal or substance use treatment.

Vice Chair Lonné Amir asked about if/how these budget changes can affect counselor support within SFUSD and schools, to which Gibbs said they're not certain since the budget is still being discussed, but they're looking realigning support more towards rehousing and other services that the State of California recently changed how much they need to allocate to each category of care.

Chair Listana asked what the methodology was when it came to their decisions on budget cuts to programs like Sunday Streets, to which Gibbs said they had to find reductions to non-essential programs to meet the \$20 million reduction for the 2026/27 city budget, and focus spending on direct service and care. Chair Listana asked how DPH has done youth-specific community input in their budget conversations, to which Gibbs said they've been working mainly with their contract partners, posting information on their website, and various other outreach avenues. Chair Listana asked why DPH gave a grant to Sunday Streets to begin with, to which Gibbs said she isn't sure why, since it seems more fitting in Rec & Park or another department.

Commissioner Mon asked about the Sugary Drinks Distributor Tax Advisory Committee recommendations and how they play a part in the budget process, to which Gibbs said that there are department staff recommendations that are unfortunately not taken into consideration as well, but said that youth dental care remains a priority.

Chair Listana asked if part of the general fund is used for food insecurity, to which Gibbs said that the SDDTAC revenue goes into the general fund, and that the \$40 million in revenues does fund a vast majority of the services it seeks to provide.

Officer Conboy entered the meeting at 5:45pm.

b. Public Defender's Office Budget Presentation

- i. Presenter: Mano Raju, Public Defender

Public Defender Raju gave a presentation on the budget proposal for the Office of the Public Defender.

Officer Mordehai asked how they plan to fund the positions they need and how the disparities between public safety departments, to which Raju said they will continue to educate the public on the important aspects of their work. Raju said that public safety has too often been equated to incarceration, rather than looking at society's worst problems that result in people being trapped.

Commissioner Trujillo asked about their legal education programs, such as the Know Your Rights trainings, to which Raju said he speaks about a lot of these issues to a lot of people, they have a young public defender program that they recruit new defenders into, and are eager to partner with organizations to provide Know Your Rights trainings.

Commissioner Azad asked about the recent ruling by Judge Dorfman and how that affected their office's ability to manage the workload crisis, to which Raju said that ruling was unprecedented in his office being punished for not having the capacity to adequately address each case that they take on and not just have a 'warm body' who takes the case and doesn't deliver justice. Raju said that some of his staff gets burnt out and struggles with their mental health from the overwhelming stress of their roles.

Officer Shah asked about juvenile recitivism, to which Raju said they focus on surrounding youth with access to critical programs while also ensuring that they're protecting each young person's constitutional rights.

Commissioner Elias asked how their office will ensure youth programs remain operational with grants facing cuts, to which Raju said they use their connections within the community to ensure that the rights and health of young people are prioritized.

Commissioner Yang asked what more can be done to address the staffing crisis in their office to ensure better services and funding parity, to which Raju said he is very passionate about strategic planning and he hopes that the ability to hire even a few defenders or investigators can ease the massive workload off of their current staff team. Yang asked if hiring more staff would change the overall percentage of their office spending on staff (92%), to which Raju said that it's the caseload that would be the focus on why they need more staff.

Chair Listana called for a 5-minute recess at 6:23pm, and called the meeting back to order at 6:32pm.

7. Legislation Referred

- a. BOS File No. 251003 - [Administrative Code - Expanding Drug-Free Permanent Supportive Housing]** - Ordinance amending the Administrative Code to state that it is City policy to expand the availability of Site-Based Permanent Supportive Housing ("PSH") that prohibits on-site illicit drug use among residents ("Drug-Free PSH") to meet the demand of people experiencing homelessness who prefer such a residential option; bar the City from funding new Site-Based PSH for people experiencing homelessness that prohibits evictions on the basis of drug use alone ("Drug-Tolerant PSH"), except where operation of the housing as Drug-Free PSH would conflict with standards imposed by law or by a condition of other funding, or the Board of Supervisors has waived the funding prohibition based on specific findings; and require the Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing ("HSH") to survey residents of Site-Based PSH to assess their interest in living in either

Drug-Tolerant PSH or Drug-Free PSH and report on the survey findings and HSH's strategies to meet PSH residents' demands.

i. Presenters: Legislative Affairs Officers

Officer Conboy introduced the legislation and said it has been a controversial issue, and that the Youth Commission may want to give comments.

Officer Conboy, seconded by Officer Mordehai, motioned to table BOS File No. 251003. Discussion:

Acting Director Zhan asked for questions they may have so that she can invite a legislative aide from Supervisor Dorsey's office to present on this item. Officer Conboy asked "How does drug-free vs. drug-tolerant housing impact youth?" and "Where will the funding come from in the City budget and is it already appropriated?".

b. BOS File No. 260307 - [Condemning ICE Action at San Francisco International Airport] - Resolution condemning Immigration and Customs

Enforcement (ICE) Action; urging the United States Congress to fund the Transportation and Security Agency; and urging San Francisco Law Enforcement Agencies to recommit to Sanctuary City policies.

i. Presenter: Legislative Affairs Officers

Officer Mordehai introduced the legislation and said that they were waiting to see what the Board of Supervisors was going to do since it was referred to the Public Safety and Neighborhood Services Committee, and that they can either support this or provide comments on the legislation. Chair Listana said that based on the previous actions of the Youth Commission, that they should vote in support of a positive recommendation on this legislation. Commissioner Oram agrees with Chair Listana. Chair Listana commented that we should ask why it was referred to the committee, and state that they support the resolution in its current form, and would want to see how the agencies they listed should commit to Sanctuary City policies.

Commissioner Marlow, seconded by Commissioner Oram, motioned to positively recommend BOS File No. 260307, with comments. No discussion. No public comment. The motion carried by the following voice vote:

Resolution urging the Mayor's Office of Housing and Community Development (MOHCD) and the San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency (SFMTA) to prioritize the remaining 100 Affordable Housing units at the Potrero Yard Modernization Project and formally commit to producing an additional 365 units of affordable housing to mitigate the loss of units at the Potrero Yard Modernization Project.

- i. Presenters: Legislative Affairs Officers

Officer Mordehai introduced the legislation. Acting Director Zhan asked for everyone to read the legislation before the meetings so they're prepared to discuss them during the meetings. Commissioners asked multiple questions regarding the resolution with YC Staff.

b. Resolution No. 2526-AL-17 - [San Francisco-Wide Youth Pick-Up Soccer Day] - Resolution in Support of a San Francisco-Wide Youth Pick-Up Soccer Day. (First Reading)

- i. Sponsor: Azad

Commissioner Azad read the resolution into the record. Vice Chair Lonné Amir appreciated the resolution and how wholesome it is. Commissioner Marlow said some of the language could be more clear around how departments will participate in this and what civic engagement he means. Commissioner Mon said there are organizations that are already doing the work that would likely be partners in making this event happen. Commissioner Oram said it would be good to include local professional soccer clubs. Commissioner Yang gave a suggestion about aligning the event with other events. Chair Listana suggested possibly including this be multiple events happening simultaneously instead of just one event. Commissioner Mon said that SFUSD can be removed since the resolution is recreation-focused rather than school district focused.

c. Resolution No. 2526-AL-18 - [Bike Safety and Funding on Arguello] - Resolution urging the Mayor and Board of Supervisors to Revisit Safety Technologies on Arguello Boulevard and Funding Put Aside After Cyclist Ethan Boyes' Death in 2023. (First Reading)

Commissioner Oram read the resolution into the record. Commissioner Marlow thanked Oram for writing the resolution to address the death of someone in District 2. Chair Listana echoed the importance of addressing cyclist safety in that area.

- d. Resolution No. 2526-AL-19 - [SFUSD School Lunches]** - Resolution Urging the Mayor and Board of Supervisors to Work With SFUSD to Provide Nutritious and Delicious School Lunches for all SFUSD Students, Prioritizing Expanding Refresh Meals to Elementary Schools. (First Reading)
