The San Francisco Youth Commission's Civic Engagement and Education Committee met in-person with remote viewing, on March 9, 2026, with Chair Yang presiding.

6. Icebreaker (Discussion)

The Committee goes through an icebreaker.

7. Committee Business (Discussion/Action)

- a. 2025/2026 Budget and Policy Priorities
 - i. Discussion on Budget and Policy Prioritization
 - ii. Reflecting on Process

The Committee goes through a “Rose Bud and Thorn” process to evaluate their experience with the Budget and Policy Priorities (BPP) process.

Chair Yang

Rose: She had no worries about not passing any of the CEEC BPPs.

Bud: Cross-committee collaborations were new to navigate. Commissioners could be more responsible and held accountable for writing their own BPPs.

Thorn: There was an uneven distribution of work.

Commissioner Conboy

Rose: All CEEC BPPs are well-liked and addressed the issues she cared about.

Thorn: Collaboration was a little difficult, especially when it came to cross-committee collaboration.

Bud: Commissioners can practice working together for cross-committee BPPs.

Vice Chair Marlow

Rose: She finished her BPPs!

Bud: She wished she was able to do more research on the SFUSD curriculum and resources.

Thorn: There was uneven distribution of work.

Commissioner Elias

Rose: The end product is finished and came together.

Thorn & Bud: There needed better communication when it comes to cross collaborations.

Commissioner Moreno

Rose : She wrote about an issue she was passionate about.

Bud: She thought it might be better to start writing earlier.

Thorn: There was difficulty when it came to cross collaboration and there was a lack of communication.

Commissioner Conboy echoes Commissioner Elias's point about not wanting to overstep, so making assignments clearer would be helpful and figuring out how to leave comments. Commissioner Elias expressed not knowing where to step up during the Youth Violence BPPs, and she hopes for more opportunity for in-person cross-collaboration. Commissioners Moreno and Elias echo for more communication between Commissioners.

For the cross-collaborated BPPs, the Committee to delegate the Climate BPP with the Housing, Recreation, and Transit Committee and the Food Insecurity and Youth Violence Prevention BPPs with the Transformative Justice Committee.

Commissioner Conboy wants to prioritize mental health. Chair Yang wants to prioritize gender-based violence and mental health, but the only setback might be the recommendations are very targeted to SFUSD. Commissioner Moreno wants to prioritize college prep access such as afterschool programming. Commissioner Elias wants to prioritize gender-based violence, mental health, and curriculum. Staff points out the curriculum could be a longer term advocacy, and Commissioner Elias agrees. Vice Chair Marlow wants to prioritize gender-based violence and mental health.

The Committee narrows the priorities to gender-based violence and mental health.

- b. Resolution No. 2526-AL-11 - Resolution to Support MyPath Bill of RYTS
 - i. Sponsor: Yang

Vice Chair Marlow is still getting information from the CBOs. The resolution will be reviewed on the 03/23 CEEC and will not be on the 03/16 FYC. The committee members will add their clauses. The Committee works on the resolution and the economic bill of rights updates. Chair Yang requests the committee to present updates at the next CEEC meeting.

- c. Resolution No. 2526-AL-14 - Recognition of Sexual Assault Awareness and Prevention Month
 - i. Sponsors: Marlow, Moreno

Vice Chair Marlow presents the resolution draft to the Committee and asks for input and collaboration. Staff suggests the resolution include more recent data and anecdotes.

Vice Chair Marlow left the room at 6:00 PM and returned at 6:00 PM. Vice Chair Marlow left the room at 6:02 PM and returned at 6:04 PM.

d. CEEC-related Updates

MyPath invited CEEC to present their youth program at the SF LGBT Center on Thursday after 4pm. The Committee decides to reschedule the meeting after finishing the resolution.

Commissioner Elias is starting a resolution draft to address civic engagement education in media and media literacy. Commission Conboy suggests providing insights from her educational non-profit, where she teaches underserved youth about civics. The Committee will look into the information on misinformation, the impact of AI on media, what is considered media literacy, and the discrepancies.

Vice Chair Marlow speaks about the SOMA shooting case. Staff provides event updates. Chair Yang talks more about the Voters of Tomorrow Youth Summit.
