

1	[Supporting City College of San Francisco]
2	Resolution calling on the Mayor and the Board of Supervisors to support the efforts to
3	keep City College accredited and open
4	
5	WHEREAS, City College of San Francisco (CCSF) is the largest community college in
6	California serving nearly 100,000 students, and employing many Bay Area residents as
7	instructors, faculty, and administrative staff; and
8	WHEREAS, Since opening its doors in 1935, CCSF has played an active role in the
9	lives and educational achievements of Bay Area residents of all ages, ethnic, academic, and
10	socio-economic backgrounds; and
11	WHEREAS, Including its main campus on Ocean Avenue in San Francisco's 7 th
12	supervisorial district, CCSF currently has 9 campuses and additional sites that serve the
13	diverse neighborhoods of San Francisco and demonstrate CCSF's investment in the
14	educational well being of all San Francisco residents; and
15	WHEREAS, Many San Francisco Unified School District graduates attend CCSF after
16	graduation; and
17	WHEREAS, After graduating with their Associates degree, many CCSF students
18	continue their higher education at a California State University (CSU) or University of
19	California (UC) institution and
20	WHEREAS, In early July, 2012, the Accrediting Commission for Community and Junio
21	Colleges (ACCJC) released a devastating report that calls into question the future viability or
22	CCSF and demands that CCSF institute changes to address over a dozen major structural
23	issues; now, therefore be it

1	RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Youth Commission calls on the Mayor and the
2	Board of Supervisors to support City College of San Francisco and the efforts to keep City
3	College open for all Bay Area students and residents; and be it further
4	WHEREAS, That the Youth Commission encourages Mayor and Board of Supervisors
5	to consider, in particular, the feasibility of lending in-kind technical support (perhaps with
6	Controller's Office staff) to City College of San Francisco, their administration, and the
7	Community College District Board, assisting the efforts of CCSF as they move towards
8	resolving the ACCJC concerns detailed in their report by the October 15, 2012 deadline.
