YEF Community Funders

Community Funders are responsible for the review and disbursement of YEF Mini-Grant Funds. Community Funders read & score mini-grant applications, interview applicants, and use a consensus model to make funding decisions. Community Funders are also responsible for following mini-grantee progress and hosting a youth-leader event. Additionally, Community Funders serve as facilitators for YEF's Youth Advocacy Day. Community Funders support the training of participants in YEF's Youth Giving Project. Up to 12 high school students (must have completed YEF's Youth Giving Project), PT 4-6 hours/week, \$12.25/hour

YEF Mini-Grants

YEF awards \$125,000 annually in mini-grants supporting projects initiated and led by youth citywide. Young people in San Francisco can apply for up to \$10,000, 3 times a year, to fund their unique ideas and vision addressing important community issues and need.

YEF Youth Giving Project

YEF's Social Justice & Philanthropy program. Youth learn about Philanthropy, Critical Social Justice grantmaking, understanding of San Francisco social issues as well as its unique neighborhood communities, and funding for current youth needs. Youth Giving Project awards \$10,000 in mini-grant funding for the summer mini-grant cycle. Youth who have successfully participated in Youth Giving Project are qualified to apply for a Community Funder position in the upcoming school year (August). 10-12 high school students (priority registration for freshman and seniors), meetings 1xmonth April – July, youth receive \$100 participation stipends 1xmonth

Youth Advocacy Day (YAD)

Youth Advocacy Day is an historic day of civic engagement for San Francisco's youth. Held each spring, Youth Advocacy Day brings nearly 200 high school students into City Hall to participate in hands-on civic engagement. Youth speak directly to their elected city officials through panel discussions and workshops. Citywide youth activism and advocacy are spotlighted during YAD. Since 2010, YAD has brought over 600 youth into San Francisco's city government.

Youth Warrior Award & Recognition

The annual Youth Warrior Award is awarded to 12-16 young leaders who have made a commitment to using their knowledge, skills, and talents to better themselves as well as the communities around them. Youth Warriors are nominated by community-based organizations throughout San Francisco and celebrated annually at City Hall.

The Youth Empowerment Fund Advisory Board (YEFAB)

Established in 2006, YEFAB is the lead decision maker determining The Youth Empowerment Fund's grants and funding strategies, www.dcyf.org. Outstanding youth leaders representing the varied communities that make up San Francisco provide direction and oversight to The Youth Empowerment Fund. YEFAB partners with other youth leadership groups to ensure that youth voice is incorporated in the city's decision-making processes. Current YEFAB membership is comprised of YEF's Community Funders and Youth Giving Project participants.
