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2	Resolution in Support of AB 1157 to provide relief to families struggling with
3	rental price increases by lowering yearly increases from 5% to 2% adjusted to
4	inflation.
5	WHEREAS, Renters make up 44% of households in California, above the
6	national average of 35%; and
7	WHEREAS, In San Francisco, renters make up 65% of households; and
8	WHEREAS, The average rent for a one-bedroom apartment in San Francisco is
9	\$2,900 and in some areas upwards of \$3,500, with the cheapest rent being 88% higher
10	than that of the national average; and
11	WHEREAS, Home ownership is unattainable for the vast majority of residents,
12	with the median home price most recently standing at \$1.39 million; and
13	WHEREAS, According to the San Francisco 2024 Youth Homelessness Point-In-
14	Time Count, a total of 8,323 homeless individuals were counted in San Francisco; and
15	WHEREAS, 63% of transitional-aged-youth struggling with homelessness are
16	LGBTQ+; and
17	WHEREAS, Many families with youth are at risk of going homeless and are
18	struggling to keep up with the rising costs of living in San Francisco; and
19	WHEREAS, Many working class families have been forced to choose between
20	leaving the City due to high housing costs or struggling to make ends meet to be able to
21	stay; and

1	WHEREAS, Affordable housing and rent control was a top priority for the San
2	Francisco Youth Commission's 2025-2026/2026-2027 Budget Policy and Priorities
3	Report; and
4	WHEREAS, Working class families deserve affordable housing to ensure that all
5	residents have the choice to live in San Francisco without housing being a big financial
6	burden; and
7	WHEREAS, Young people are an integral part of San Francisco, yet only 13% of
8	residents are 18 or under, a direct result of the housing crisis; and
9	WHEREAS, It is imperative for San Francisco to ensure families with children
10	and youth aren't affected by displacement and rising costs of living; and
11	WHEREAS, Young people deserve to live in the city that they were born in, have
12	found community through, and made opportunities out of; and
13	WHEREAS, The cost of living should not be a barrier for young people to take full
14	advantage of San Francisco's local opportunities; and
15	WHEREAS, The 2019 Tenants Protection Act, or AB 1482, limited annual rent
16	increases to 5% with inflation; and
17	WHEREAS, The 2019 Tenants Protection Act required landlords to provide "just
18	cause" to evict a tenant; and
19	WHEREAS, Although the 2019 Tenants Protection Act has provided some relief
20	in recent years for residents, rent has continued to rise due to inflation, with a max
21	increase for Aug. 1, 2024, through July 31, 2025 set at 8.8%; and
22	WHEREAS, Under the 2019 Tenants Protection Act, single-family homes and
23	duplexes are exempt from the rent cap; and

1	WHEREAS, Updated legislation is needed to respond to an increase in rent and
2	protect existing safeguards such as rental caps; and, now, therefore be it
3	RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Youth Commission supports AB 1157,
4	which would lower the existing gross rental rate increase of 5% adjusted to inflation to
5	2% adjusted to inflation, relieving the economic burden of families struggling to keep up
6	with rising rental prices; and be it
7	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Youth Commission believes that
8	protecting families from evictions and rising rental prices is an important step to
9	ensuring the city can remain accessible for all young people; and be it
10	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Youth Commission recognizes
11	that the 2019 Tenant Protection Act is sunsetting in a few years, and updating this piece
12	of legislation is crucial to responding to current events; and be it
13	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Youth Commission urges the
14	Mayor and Board of Supervisors to urge the State Legislature to support AB 1157 and
15	demonstrate our shared commitment to fighting for tenants' rights; and be it
16	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Youth Commission urges
17	Senator Wiener, Assemblymember Haney, and Assemblymember Stefani to support AB
18	1157; and be it
19	FURTHER RESOLVED, That San Francisco Youth Commission staff shall
20	transmit a copy of this resolution to the Mayor, Board of Supervisors, and the San
21	Francisco Tenants Union.
