1	[Protecting Student Journalism]
2	Resolution urging the Mayor and Board of Supervisors to affirm and protect the
3	rights of student journalism and free speech in San Francisco.
4	WHEREAS, Student journalism provides a platform for youth voices, develops
5	media literacy skills, and fosters civic engagement in youth by offering a space for open
6	discussion and the sharing of ideas; and
7	WHEREAS, Infringements on the rights of student journalists and disrupting their
8	ability to work and learn is incredibly harmful for youth and society; and
9	WHEREAS, In 2024, two Mountain View High School students sued their
10	principal and district after they were reportedly intimidated by school administration and
11	told to not publish and censor an article about sexual assault; and
12	WHEREAS, The advisor at the school stood by their students as they fought
13	back against the attempt at censorship which resulted in administration removing the
14	teacher and the introductory journalism class at the school; and
15	WHEREAS, A similar incident recently occurred at Lowell High School in San
16	Francisco, where their student publication, The Lowell, published a controversial article
17	covering verbal harassment by teachers; and
18	WHEREAS, The San Francisco Chronicle published an article about the incident
19	on April 23, 2025; and
20	WHEREAS, According to quotes from the program's advisor, student editors
21	were called into a meeting after the article was published, where they declined
22	administration's request to view every issue in advance; and

1	WHEREAS, The program's advisor, Eric Gustafson, stood by the decision made
2	by the students and was then reassigned from being journalism advisor by
3	administration; and
4	WHEREAS, Although both of these cases are still pending and ongoing, their
5	existence sends a negative message to student journalists in San Francisco; and
6	WHEREAS, The freedom of press and speech is a guaranteed right and students
7	feeling pressured to censor their words and ideas is unacceptable; and be it
8	RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Youth Commission supports the
9	advancement and continuation and student journalism; and be it
10	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Youth Commission urges the
11	Mayor and Board of Supervisors to protect the rights of journalists and provide the
12	necessary resources and tools to support and empower both youth and adult
13	journalists.
